(Nashville)-Judge Randall Wyatt has sentenced a former TSA agent to six months in jail for secretly videotaping a co-worker inside an airport restroom. Daniel Boykin, 33, was ordered to serve six-months in jail and five-and-a-half years on community corrections after pleading guilty to unlawful photography, aggravated burglary and violation of the computer act. Assistant District Attorney Amy Hunter, who called the case one of the most invasive and offensive crimes she's prosecuted, said she is pleased with the judge's ruling.

"We believe that it is a fair sentence under the facts and circumstances of this case. We are particularly satisfied that GPS monitoring and counseling are part of the judgment," General Hunter said. In addition to secretly videotaping the victim, Boykin stole photos from her home and computer. More than 90 videos and 1,500 photos of the victim were found on Boykin's phone and computer. In handing down the sentence, Judge Wyatt said it was difficult to imagine a more intrusive evasion of privacy and called Boykin's conduct egregious. General Hunter agreed. "We are thankful that the sentence includes periodic confinement so that the sentence will hopefully make an impression on this defendant and others."
