

On 04/27/2023 at 1836, FTO Megan Arnett, Officer Kyle Kinsman, and I were dispatched to a kidnapping in progress. The dispatcher relayed to us that a male subject wearing blue sweatpants and a Fortnite backpack was pulling a female wearing a green shirt against her will. While enroute, FTO Arnett and I observed (2) individuals matching the description walking outbound on the southern sidewalk on Murfreesboro Pike. Officer Arnett conducted a u-turn and we separated the parties. The male, later identified as Jasaveon Wilson, was apprehensive to speak with FTO Arnett and the alleged victim, later identified as Ke'Maria West, was apprehensive to speak with me. Mr. Wilson repeatedly attempted to get Ms. West to come with him so they could walk away from us.


While speaking to Ms. West, my back was turned toward Mr. Wilson and I heard Officer Kinsman inform Mr. Wilson that he was under arrest. I saw Mr. Wilson in the corner of my eye pull away from officers by tugging his arms towards himself and begin to run inbound on Murfreesboro Pike. I proceeded to pursue Mr. Wilson on foot, along with Officers Kinsman, Adam Kauffman, and FTO Laura Williams. Mr. Wilson proceeded to run from the sidewalk on south side of Murfreesboro Pike across the street to the sidewalk on the north side and then back to the sidewalk on the south side. Once Mr. Wilson completed running across the street, he slowed down and Officer Kinsman tackled him by wrapping his arms around Mr. Wilson and brought him to the ground. Mr. Wilson landed on his stomach and once on the ground, he tucked his hands and arms underneath himself and tensed up, preventing Officers Kinsman, Kauffman, FTO Williams, and I from placing them behind his back. FTO Williams was able to get his right hand out from under him and place it behind his back when Mr. Wilson began to complain that his wrist was hurting and shouted, "ASTHMA!" I maintained weight on Mr. Wilson's right shoulder with my left hand and kept his head down utilizing my right forearm as he was struggling against us.

Once handcuffs were applied, Officers Kinsman and Kauffman helped Mr. Wilson up and we began walking with him towards our cars and I walked with them having no physical contact with Mr. Wilson. As we approached Ms. West, I went to FTO Arnett to assist her in keeping Ms. West at bay if she were to attempt to intervene with the other officers. As Mr. Wilson and the officers passed by Ms. West, he went limp, preventing their forward progress with him. I was instructed by FTO Arnett to assist the other officers by assisting FTO Williams pick up Mr. Wilson's feet up and I assisted her in maintaining control of his legs by placing them under my left arm. Mr. Wilson then began to thrash about and the decision to utilize a hobble restraint was made. We then carried Mr. Wilson to a grassy area and placed him on the ground. I maintained a squat over Mr. Wilson's legs, keeping my buttocks off of him and pinned his legs down with both of my hands to prevent him from kicking or tucking his legs underneath himself. Officer Kauffman retrieved and applied his hobble restraint to Mr. Wilson. We then picked Mr. Wilson up and I carried his legs towards Officer Kinsman's patrol car. Once at the car, I placed his legs down and my interaction with Mr. Wilson concluded. Once my interaction with Mr. Wilson had concluded, the Nashville Fire Department was called. I did not hear nor see who had called the Nashville Fire Department. When the fire department arrived, Mr. Wilson refused treatment and Officer Kinsman transported him to booking.

On 04/27/2023 at approximately 1835 hours, I Officer Kyle Kinsman was dispatched to [redacted] Nashville, TN 37210 in what initially came out as a kidnapping call. I arrived on scene and made contact with Jasaveon Wilson, the defendant who was already speaking with Officer Megan Arnett while standing on the sidewalk just 30 yards south of [redacted] Nashville, Tn 37210. I asked Mr. Wilson what had taken place between himself and Ke'Maria West, the victim who was standing 15 yards behind me speaking with Officer Ryan Ynzunza. Mr. Wilson refused to provide any answers related to the incident and would not provide me with his name or date of birth. The only statement Mr. Wilson made was that Ms. West was his girlfriend and they might have been "loud." During our conversation, Mr. Wilson attempted to walk around me towards Ms. West, and it was at this point I told Mr. Wilson he was being detained and to not walk any closer towards Ms. West, Mr. Wilson understood and stopped.

With Mr. Wilson refusing to provide me with any more information, I asked Officer Adam Kauffman who was standing to my left to stay with Mr. Wilson while I speak with Officer Ynzunza to see if Ms. West had provided any information on what took place between herself and Mr. Wilson. Officer Ynzunza told me that Ms. West stated she and Mr. Wilson got into a verbal argument that led to her pushing Mr. Wilson and in turn Mr. Wilson pushing her back but nothing more than that. I also spoke with Officer Arnett to see if she was able to get a positive identity for Mr. Wilson and Ms. West. While speaking with Officer Arnett, Officer Laura Williams walked over to us and gave us the phone of Isaiah Henderson, the Trevecca University security guard, that placed the initial call for service. Mr. Henderson had a five-minute video he recorded and saved on his phone of Mr. Wilson holding Ms. West by her green sweatshirt and refusing to let her go despite her repeatedly asking to be let go so she could get away. After watching the video, I walked over to Mr. Henderson who was standing outside of his security vehicle parked in the center lane of Murfreesboro Pike about 20 yards south from where I was. I confirmed with Mr. Henderson that what I watched on the video was accurate and have him tell me in his own words what he witnessed. With Mr. Henderson's video and statements, I determined Mr. Wilson to be the primary aggressor of the domestic violence incident between himself and Ms. West with probable cause to arrest Mr. Wilson for Domestic Assault, Offensive or provocative contact.

I walked from Mr. Henderson back to the sidewalk about 10 yards behind Mr. Wilson who was facing away from me and speaking with Officers Kauffman and Williams. I walked up behind Mr. Wilson, took my handcuffs out, and advised "Mr. Wilson you are under arrest, place your hands behind your back." I grabbed Mr. Wilson's cell phone that was in his right hand while Officer Kauffman took off Mr. Wilson's back pack. As soon as Officer Kauffman took off Mr. Wilson's backpack, Mr. Wilson started running from us in a full sprint across Murfreesboro Pike headed North bound. I dropped my handcuffs and laid down Mr. Wilson's phone on the ground and pursued Mr. Wilson on foot. While pursuing Mr. Wilson on foot I, gave him verbal commands to get on the ground and to stop right now. Mr. Wilson ignored my verbal commands and kept running, crossing back over Murfreesboro Pike just to the right of the Trevecca University entrance in a grass field. As soon as Mr. Wilson got to the grass, I caught up to him, put both hands on his upper back and pushed him down to the ground. With Mr. Wilson on the ground, I gave him verbal commands to roll over to his chest, grabbed both his arms, and rolled him to his right over onto his chest. Mr. Wilson then puts his hands down in his waistband and I gave him verbal commands to take his hands out of his waist band, while I grabbed his left forearm with both of my hands and pulled his left arm out and put it behind his back while Officer Kauffman and Officer Williams put Mr. Wilson's right arm behind his back. With both hands behind his back, Officer Kauffman handcuffs Mr. Wilson with his hands behind his back.
