Once Officer Kauffman had the handcuffs double locked, I grabbed Mr. Wilson's right arm with both hands and rolled him to his right side and sat him up. I then put my left arm under Mr. Wilson's right arm, while Officer Kauffman put his right arm under Mr. Wilson's left arm and we both lifted Mr. Wilson to his feet at the same time. We both kept our arms under Mr. Wilson's arms and walked with Mr. Wilson back to my patrol car that was parked on the right side of Murfreesboro Pike about 100 yards south of us.

When we walked past the Subway parking lot and near Ms. West, who was still standing on the sidewalk, Mr. Wilson kicked his feet out in front of him and put all his weight on my left arm and Officer Kauffman's right arm. We kept our arms in place and lifted Mr. Wilson back up to his feet while Officer Williams and Officer Ynzunza grabbed Mr. Wilson's legs and lifted them up. All four of us walk with Mr. Wilson in the air for a couple yards before Officer Williams and Officer Ynzunza set Mr. Wilson legs back down onto the sidewalk. As soon as Mr. Wilson got his feet down, he started pulling and yanking left and right trying to get Officer Kauffman and I to break our grip with our arms that were still under his arms. With Mr. Wilson still actively resisting us by pulling away and kicking out his legs, we decided to take Mr. Wilson to the grass and place him stomach down to get him to calm down. I kept my left arm under Mr. Wilson's right arm and placed my right hand on Mr. Wilson's upper back and pushed down slowly while Officer Williams did the same from the left side creating a slowed, control descent to the grass with Mr. Wilson on his stomach. Once on the ground, I kept my hands in place, with Officer Williams doing the same and Officer Ynzunza holding down Mr. Wilson's legs while Officer Kauffman retrieved his hobble restraints from his car. Once Officer Kauffman returned and put the hobble restraints on Mr. Wilson's legs, Officer Williams and I rolled Mr. Wilson over to his left side so he can sit up by me grabbing his left arm and pulling him towards me.

With Mr. Wilson now sitting up, I put my right arm under his left arm while Officer Williams does the same on the right side and Officers Kauffman and Ynzunza grab Mr. Wilson's legs and all four of us lift Mr. Wilson off the ground at the same time. We carried Mr. Wilson towards my patrol car to put Mr. Wilson in the back seat. Once we made it to the back of my patrol car, Officers Kauffman and Ynzunza set Mr. Wilson's legs down on the ground so myself and Officer Williams could search Mr. Wilson before putting him in the back seat of my patrol car. Once the search was done, Mr. Wilson sat down on the ground refusing to get into the back seat of my patrol car. Officer Williams went around to the left side of the car to pull Mr. Wilson in by his legs while myself and Officer Kauffman lift Mr. Wilson off the ground with our hand on his leg and the other under his arm. The three of us were able to slide Mr. Wilson into the back seat and sit him up with myself and Officer Kauffman pushing up with our hands on Mr. Wilson's upper back. When Mr. Wilson sat up, he grabbed the seat belt buckle with his right hand and refused to let it go as I gave multiple verbal commands for Mr. Wilson to let it go. Mr. Wilson still refused, I attempted to get the buckle out of Mr. Wilson's hand by using my hands to separate his fingers, but he kept resisting. With Mr. Wilson refusing to let us buckle him up, I closed the right door while Officer Kauffman closed the left.

With Mr. Wilson in the back seat of my patrol car, I collected his belongings and put them in a bag to take with me to turn into booking. While I was picking up Mr. Wilson's backpack, he started kicking the right rear window of my patrol car. Officer Williams opened the door to hold him while I grabbed the end of the hobble restraint and secured the end of it in the front passenger compartment to keep Mr. Wilson from kicking out my patrol car windows. With Mr. Wilson secured, I transported him down to booking with Officers Kauffman and Williams following me. Once inside the secured booking area, Officers Kauffman and Williams took off the hobble restraints off Mr. Wilson's feet while I grabbed his belongings. Officer Kauffman, Officer Williams and I, walked with Mr. Wilson and stayed with him until he was transferred into DCSO custody.

On 04/27/2023 around 1834 hours I responded to [redacted] Nashville TN 37210 to respond to reports of an alleged kidnapping in progress. When I arrived on scene, Officers Megan Arnett, Ryan Ynzunza, and Kyle Kinsman had already begun investigating and determined that no kidnapping had occurred however this was a domestic incident. The parties had already been separated and were refusing to identify themselves. I spoke with a nearby private security guard who provided video footage of what he had observed and his interaction with Mr. Wilson and a juvenile female victim. The video evidence supported that Mr. Wilson would be determined as the primary aggressor in a domestic assault. I passed this information on to Officer Kinsman as he was the primary officer for the call for service.

I stood by with Mr. Wilson for several minutes discussing trespass law and assault until Officer Kinsman indicated to me that he was ready to arrest Mr. Wilson. When Officer Kinsman told Mr. Wilson that he was being arrested and gave commands to the subject to place his hands behind his back, I placed my hand around Mr. Wilson's left wrist to maintain control as Officer Kauffman removed Mr. Wilson's backpack from his shoulders. At this time Mr. Wilson suddenly pulled away toward the street. I used both hands to try to maintain contact, however Mr. Wilson was able to pull away as his jacket sleeve ripped off in my hands. Mr. Wilson ran across all lanes of traffic on Murfreesboro Pike. I chased Mr. Wilson and broadcast his description and direction of flight on my portable radio. Mr. Wilson crossed back over all lanes of traffic. As I was looking toward traffic to ensure the safety of the officers, Mr. Wilson went to the ground. I did not see the manner in which he made his way to the ground, however when I looked back to Mr. Wilson he was in the grass near the entrance to Trevecca Nazarene University. I saw Officers Kauffman, Kinsman, and Ynzunza struggling to gain control of Mr. Wilson's hands as he layed on them facing the ground. I fished my arm between Mr. Wilson's right elbow and shoulder and used that leverage to pull Mr. Wilson's hand out from under him. During this contact, I gave verbal commands to "put your hands behind your back." I maintained control of Mr. Wilson's right hand behind his back until Officer Kinsman and Officer Kauffman were able to place both hands in handcuffs. Mr. Wilson immediately complained of having asthma as Officer Kauffman double locked the handcuffs to prevent unnecessary tightness. I explained to Mr. Wilson that as soon as the handcuffs were appropriately locked, we would help him to stand.

Officer Kinsman and I assisted Mr. Wilson to a standing position by giving commands to roll over, sit up, and then gripping Mr. Wilson's arm just under his armpit and raising his body weight off the ground as he stood up. Once standing, I let go of Mr. Wilson's left arm. Officer Kinsman and Kauffman began to escort him back to the police cars. As we walked past the victim and would not allow Mr. Wilson to stop and speak with the victim, Mr. Wilson dropped all of his body weight toward the ground and lifted his legs off of the ground in an attempt to stop all forward motion. I attempted to assist from behind in lifting Mr. Wilson's weight back to a standing position. He continued resisting by dropping his body weight to the ground and kicking his legs, so I moved in front of Mr. Wilson to lift his legs and assist in carrying him to the police car. He began kicking at Officer Ynzunza and I making it unsafe to continue carrying him. I made the decision to move Mr. Wilson to the ground to gain control and reassess in a safer position.

Officers Kinsman, Kauffman, and I carefully placed Mr. Wilson on the ground controlling his shoulders as we swept his legs out from under him. As we approached the ground, he dug the crown of his head into the grass intentionally. I warned Mr. Wilson that so long as we could not safely move toward the police cars, we would remain on the ground. Officer Kauffman retrieved and applied hobble restraints to Mr. Wilson's ankles to prevent additional kicking toward officers. I gave a verbal command to Mr. Wilson to roll toward Officer Kinsman and then maintained control of Mr. Wilson's right shoulder as we lifted him completely from the ground and carried him to the car. When we arrived at the police car and attempted to stand Mr. Wilson up to be searched, he began twisting and pushing away again. At this point, the stop/start button on my Body Worn Camera was pushed and footage briefly stopped but immediately restarted in a new video. All footage is captured in the 60 second overlap.

Officer Kinsman and I held Mr. Wilson against the car to complete a search incident to arrest as he refused to remain standing without the support of officers and the car. I removed some marijuana and other personal items from Mr. Wilson's right pocket and placed them on the ground before giving commands to Mr. Wilson to get into the marked patrol car. Mr. Wilson again dropped all of his weight to the ground and refused to voluntarily sit in the patrol car. I went to the opposite side of the prisoner compartment of the patrol car to assist in pulling Mr. Wilson's legs into the vehicle while still in the hobble restraints. Mr. Wilson refused to sit up so that he could be placed in a seatbelt and so that the doors could safely be closed. Mr. Wilson grasped the seatbelt buckle in his hands. I observed Officer Kauffman apply a pressure point under Mr. Wilson's jaw, however Officer Kauffman needed his hand to gain control of the seatbelt buckle. I then applied pressure to that same pressure point on the left of Mr. Wilson's jaw while giving repeated verbal commands to let go of the belt buckle. I then traded positions with Officer Kauffman and attempted to gain "pain compliance" through joint manipulation of Mr. Wilson's shoulder by lifting his hands upwards. All pressure point and joint manipulation techniques were unsuccessful and we closed the patrol car door without buckling Mr. Wilson in.

Moments after we closed the door, I heard a repeated thumping noise coming from the prisoner compartment of the patrol vehicle where Mr. Wilson was seated. It sounded as if he was attempting to kick out the window, so I opened the door to prevent damage to the vehicle. Mr. Wilson lunged out of the car and so I pushed him back into the car first by pushing his shoulders into the car, then by placing constant pressure against Mr. Wilson's jawline with my forearm as he kept sticking his head out of the door. Once Mr. Wilson's body was in the car, he attempted to keep his foot in the door hinge. I gave several warnings that the door would be closed and commands to put his foot in the car before closing the door.

No further physical contact was made on scene with Mr. Wilson

Sgt. Plancic responded to the scene.

On 04/27/23, at approximately 1835 hours, I was dispatched to Trevecca Nazarene University Campus located on [redacted] Prior to my arrival Officer, Kyle Kinsman, Officer, Megan Arnett and Officer, Ryan Ynzunza had made contact with Mr. Jasaveon Wilson and his girlfriend at [redacted] Both myself and Officer, Laura Williams arrived on scene simultaneously. Once on scene I spoke with Mr. Wilson.

While speaking with Mr. Wilson for roughly fifteen minutes he told me he was nineteen and his girlfriend was eighteen. Mr. Wilson states he was at Trevecca Towers visiting his grandma who lives in one of the towers located on the property. Mr. Wilson states as he was leaving his grandma's apartment and he was talking loudly with his girlfriend, and "play fighting." Mr. Wilson states he was approached by Trevecca Security and told to leave. Mr. Wilson states security was extremely rude so he "treated him like he was being treated" and was rude back with security. During my conversation with Mr. Wilson, Officer, Williams also attempted to explain the TCA Criminal Trespassing statute to Mr. Wilson. Officer, Kinsman also spoke with Trevecca Security during this time. After Officer, Kinsman concluded with security, he returned to Mr. Wilson and advised him he was being arrested for domestic assault against his girlfriend.

While taking Mr. Wilson into custody, I began to remove his Fortnite backpack, and during this time he pulled his arms and body away from police. Mr. Wilson pulled away from police and ran across all lanes of traffic on Murfreesboro Pike into Hermitage sector. I immediately gave chase and pursued Mr. Wilson on foot, running inbound on Murfreesboro Pike. During the foot pursuit, Officer, Kinsman gave a verbal command to Mr. Wilson to stop running. Mr. Wilson ignored this command and crossed all lanes of traffic on Murfreesboro Pike for a second time and ran back into South sector where he was then tackled around his waist and taken to the grass by Officer, Kinsman. While on the grass, Mr. Wilson continued to ignore police commands to stop moving and stop resisting. Mr. Wilson would not stop kicking his legs, so I placed both of my knees on the ground while sitting on the back of his calves and placed him in handcuffs. Once handcuffed, Mr. Wilson was turned from his belly, sat to his butt, and picked up to his feet by his under arms by Officer Kinsman and Officer Williams, and began walking back to the patrol vehicles.

Roughly halfway back to the patrol vehicles, Mr. Wilson refused to walk and sat down on the ground. While on the ground, Mr. Wilson began kicking his feet so I then placed him in a hobble restraint. Mr. Wilson was then carried by his legs and under his shoulders the remainder of the walk back to the patrol car. While at the patrol vehicle, Mr. Wilson once again refused to stand up, pushed his body weight back on police and refused to enter the patrol vehicle. Myself, along with Officer Kinsman and Officer Williams had to pick up Mr. Wilson by his under arms and place him in the patrol car.

Once Mr. Wilson was in the patrol vehicle, he continued to push his body weight back on police, would not sit upright in the seat or bend his knees. At one point, Mr. Wilson opened his mouth and quickly bit and released his mouth from the seat belt I was holding. In an attempt to get Mr. Wilson secured in the vehicle, I used pressure points underneath his jaw line, which were unsuccessful. With the assistance of Officer, Williams, Officer, Kinsman and Officer, Arnett, Mr. Wilson was safely secured in the patrol vehicle.

Mr. Wilson advised police he had wrist pain and he wanted to be seen by a medic, so NFD EMS Medic #12 arrived on scene. Mr. Wilson then told medics he refuses all treatment and EMS left. Officer, Williams and I then followed behind Officer, Kinsman to booking. Once at booking Mr. Wilson was cooperative and was transferred into DCSO custody without further incident.
